## **Parshat Toledot**

Genesis Chapter 25:19-34

## First Aliyah

<sup>19</sup> This is the story of Isaac, son of Abraham. Abraham begot Isaac. <sup>20</sup> Isaac was forty years old when he took to wife Rebekah, daughter of Bethuel the Aramean of Paddan-aram, sister of Laban the Aramean. <sup>21</sup> Isaac pleaded with the Eternal on behalf of his wife, because she was barren; and the Eternal responded to his plea, and his wife Rebekah conceived. <sup>22</sup> But the children struggled in her womb, and she said, "If so, why do I exist?" She went to inquire of the Eternal.

# Second Aliyah

<sup>23</sup> And the Eternal answered her,

"Two nations are in your womb,

Two separate peoples shall issue from your for body; One people shall be mightier than the other,

And the older shall serve the younger."

When her time to give birth was at hand, there were twins in her womb. <sup>25</sup> The first one emerged red, like a hairy mantle all over; so they named him Esau. <sup>26</sup> Then his brother emerged, holding on to the heel of Esau; so they named him Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when they were born.

## Third Aliyah

<sup>27</sup> When the boys grew up, Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the outdoors; but Jacob was a mild man who stayed in camp. <sup>28</sup> Isaac favored Esau because he had a taste for game; but Rebekah favored Jacob. <sup>29</sup> Once when Jacob was cooking a stew, Esau came in from the open, famished.

# Fourth Aliyah

<sup>30</sup> And Esau said to Jacob, "Give me some of that red stuff to gulp down, for I am famished—which is why he was named Edom. <sup>31</sup> Jacob said, "First sell me your birthright." <sup>32</sup> And Esau said, "I am at the point of death, so of what use is my birthright to me?" <sup>33</sup> But Jacob said, "Swear to me first." So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. <sup>34</sup> Jacob then gave Esau bread and lentil stew; he ate and drank, and he rose and went away. Thus did Esau spurn the birthright.
