### **Parshat Tetzaveh**

Exodus 27:20-28:12

### First Aliyah

<sup>20</sup> You shall further instruct the Israelites to bring you clear oil of beaten olives for lighting, for kindling lamps regularly. <sup>21</sup> Aaron and his sons shall set them up in the Tent of Meeting, outside the curtain which is over [the Ark of] the Pact, [to burn] from evening to morning before the Eternal. It shall be a due from the Israelites for all time, throughout the ages. <sup>28:1</sup> You shall bring forward your brother Aaron, with his sons, from among the Israelites, to serve Me as priests: Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, Eleazar and Ithamar, to the sons of Aaron.

# Second Aliyah

<sup>2</sup> Make sacral vestments for your brother Aaron, for dignity and adornment. <sup>3</sup> Next you shall instruct all who are skillful, whom I have endowed with the gift of skill, to make Aaron's vestments, for consecrating him to serve Me as priest. <sup>4</sup> These are the vestments they are to make: a breast-piece, an ephod, a robe, a fringed tunic, a headdress, and a sash. They shall make those sacral vestments for your brother Aaron and his sons, for priestly service to Me; <sup>5</sup> they, therefore, shall receive the gold, the blue, purple, and crimson yarns, and the fine linen.

### Third Aliyah

<sup>6</sup> They shall make the ephod of gold, of blue, purple, and crimson yarns, and of fine twisted linen, worked into designs. <sup>7</sup> It shall have two shoulder-pieces attached; they shall be attached at its two ends. <sup>8</sup> And the decorated band that is upon it shall be made like it, of one piece with it: of gold, of blue, purple, and crimson yarns, and of fine twisted linen. <sup>9</sup> Then take two lazuli stones and engrave on them the names of the sons of Israel:

## Fourth Aliyah

10 six of their names on the one stone, and the names of the remaining six on the other stone, in the order of their birth. 11 On the two stones you shall make seal engravings—the work of a lapidary—of the names of the sons of Israel. Having bordered them with frames of gold, attach the two stones to the shoulder-pieces of the ephod, as stones for remembrance of the Israelite people, whose names Aaron shall carry upon his two shoulder-pieces for remembrance before the Eternal.
